

Organic veg-box drop point in the Village



Crop Drop is a local not-for-profit veg box scheme that provides fresh organic produce direct from farms and growers that are as close to Haringey as possible - and at affordable prices.

There is now a new drop point location by the Estate Management Office where you can collect your veg bags on Thursdays 2-10pm and Friday to Sunday 9.30am-10pm.

If you become a member, each week you'll receive a bag of super fresh, seasonal, organic vegetables. The weekly selection will vary depending on what the farms are growing, but you will get a good mix of different things, plus recipe ideas. There's a fruit option too. Prices start at £8.40 for a small veg bag containing five varieties of seasonal veg, ideal for 1-2 people.

Tower update

Here's the latest news on the Tower from Anthology

The foundation piling work is now complete and we have created a watertight seal around the site so that we can remove excess groundwater in advance of casting mass concrete foundations.

There have been some challenging ground conditions to deal with because the water table sits very high in relation to Hale Village basement level. This caused certain complications in the work and, in some instances, resulted in work over-running the finish time of 6pm for safety reasons. We apologise for any inconvenience this caused if you were affected by the noise. The contractor takes every step possible to eliminate the chance of work going beyond 6pm. Hoardings around the site are now up with graphics and viewing holes so you can continue to view



construction progress.

The next stage of construction will be to excavate for the concrete foundations that will sit on top of the pilings. You may also notice an increase in the number of people working on the project as well as more site accommodation and vehicles.

The Community Liaison Group met on the 19th September and we will be announcing the next meeting date shortly. The Sales and Marketing Suite is also now open in Daneland Walk.

Set in a historic Grade II listed building, now the Legacy Business Centre, the Hall has been wonderfully restored to its original Art Nouveau glamour and can host up to 270 guests. The original Chamber Room is also for hire, which can hold 80-120 people.

The building was officially opened in 1896 by the Duke and Duchess of York – later to become King George V and Queen Mary – and is one of the finest venues in East London.
